

Congratulations and thanks for your purchase! We have tried to make the assembly instructions as clear and concise as possible so you can get on with enjoying your tent quickly and with minimal fuss.

We've also included some tips on how to prolong the life of your tent – if you follow this advice, you will be able to enjoy your tent for years to come!

Contents:

- 1 rain fly
- 1 inner tent
- 3 fiberglass poles
- 6 steel poles
- 6 black plastic pole joints
- 24 tent stakes
- 6 guy ropes
- 1 repair kit

Tent Assembly Instructions, Model: PIONEER

Inner tent:

- Unfold the inner tent and lay it on the ground top side facing up
- Insert the color coded fiberglass tent pole into the corresponding color coded pole sleeves
- Connect 1 black elbow to each end of the fiberglass poles
- Connect the narrow end of each steel pole to the opposite end of the black elbow noting the color coding on the steel poles to the corresponding color on the inner tent
- Note: Each black elbow should be connected to 1 fiberglass poles and 1 steel pole
- Connect the bottom of each steel pole to the inner tent using the metal pins located along the bottom edge of the inner tent by inserting the metal pin into the bottom opening of each steel pole
- Fasten the middle section of each steel pole to the inner tent using the clips located on the outside of the inner tent
- The inner tent is now assembled and can be used as a free standing shelter

Rain fly:

- Unfold the rain fly and put it on top of the assembled inner tent
- Fasten the rain fly to the inner tent by closing the Velcro straps around the assembled tent poles
- Tie the guy ropes to the guy rope tabs around the tent and stake them to the ground – this provides stability to the tent in strong winds

Caring for your tent:

1. Keep it clean: Don't set up your tent in the mud, avoid putting muddy clothing and gear in the sleeping compartments as sand and dirt can scratch the water proof coating and damage zippers
2. UV light can accelerate fabric degradation. Therefore, set up your tent in the shade when possible and use the rain fly to protect the inner tent
3. To prolong the life of your tent floor, use a separate sheet of PE fabric underneath the tent to protect against abrasion
4. When packing up, shake out dirt and sand as much as possible
5. At home, clean your tent with a damp cloth, never use harsh cleaning chemicals, and air dry
6. When storing, allow the tent to sit loosely to prevent creases
