We have tried to make the assembly instructions as clear and concise as possible so you can get on with enjoying your tent quickly and with minimal fuss.

We've also included some tips on how to prolong the life of your tent – if you follow this advice, you will be able to enjoy your tent for years to come!

Contents:

- 1 rain fly
- 1 inner tent
- 4 fiberglass poles
- 8 steel poles
- 8 black plastic pole joints
- 40 tent stakes
- 14 guy ropes
- 1 repair kit

Tent Assembly Instructions: PROTEUS

Inner tent:

1. NOTE: All poles are color coded to match the corresponding tent sleeves on the inner tent
2. Insert each tent pole into the corresponding tent sleeve
3. Insert metal pin (located along bottom edge of inner tent) into the ends of each tent pole
4. The inner tent should now stand freely on the ground
5. Stake down the inner tent through the tent stake loops (located along the bottom edge of the inner tent)

Rain fly:

1. Put rain fly on top of inner tent
2. Fasten rain fly to inner tent using the Velcro straps (located along underside of rain fly) to the inner tent poles
3. Tie the guy ropes to the guy rope tabs along the edges of the rain fly and stake to the ground – this will provide more stability against strong wind

Caring for your tent:

1. Keep it clean: Don't set up your tent in the mud, avoid putting muddy clothing and gear in the sleeping compartments as sand and dirt can scratch the water proof coating and damage zippers
2. UV light can accelerate fabric degradation. Therefore, set up your tent in the shade when possible and use the rain fly to protect the inner tent
3. To prolong the life of your tent floor, use a separate sheet of PE fabric underneath the tent to protect against abrasion
4. When packing up, shake out dirt and sand as much as possible
5. At home, clean your tent with a damp cloth, never use harsh cleaning chemicals, and air dry
6. When storing, allow the tent to sit loosely to prevent creases
